NUAR Platform Improvements:

The newest updates included:

- PDF Validity Guidance: Building on last month's improvements, users will now see clear guidance on the validity period of PDFs.
- Bug fixes: A number of minor issues have been resolved.

The upcoming release is planned to introduce:

 Live Service Notifications: NUAR portal users will start seeing banner alerts for live service updates. Improved PDF Map Visibility: Gas symbols and images in PDF maps will be reduced in size to enhance asset visibility and readability.

Chris Powell, Chair of Pillar 4, Technology, Data & Descision Making

Chris is a Street Works Specialist at CityFibre.

He brings 8 years experience across roles including coordinator, inspector, advisor, and specialist for both Highway Authorities and Statutory Undertakers. He actively contributes to industry development through groups such as the Permit Conditions Training Working Group, HV30, and SLG Training Working Group.

Sophie Cornell, Chair of Pillar 5, Collaboration and Consistency

Sophie has been involved in Street Works for 23 years - she started in electricity and then 15 years with a London Borough, before moving back to the undertaker side of things. She started off raising permits when 3 day notice periods didn't exist yet so has seen a few changes over the years! She is really passionate about education within our sector, and is excited to be part of the HAUC Vision 2030 working groups so that she can contribute to the community that she enjoys so much.



The HAUC Vision 2030 - Updates from our Vision Pillars

Pillar 1 Environment.

The group aims to minimise the environmental impact of works under three themes:

Data

Make ecological data accessible for planners and contractors to consider impacts early. We'll work with industry to share resources.

Green Innovation for Works

Promoters should cut carbon from materials, methods, and equipment. Explore initiatives like LiveLabs2 and Road to Net Zero, and share successful practices.

Biodiversity & Pollution Reduction

Driving the industry toward nature-positive practices by addressing noise, light, and air pollution impacts and exploring opportunities to improve the environment post-works.

Pillar 2 Community

The group is trialling an initiative to improve accessibility in street and road works. After initial enhancements, a live site re-trial is set for 18 November 2025. They'll also join a Highways roundtable on 2 December to tackle road worker abuse.

Key discussion points include:

Strategies to prevent violence and harassment

Best practice during confrontations

Strengthening legal protections

Building public awareness and respect

Further updates will follow after both events.

Pillar 3 Infrastructure

The group are working on Developing:

Data-sharing agreements to streamline planning and reduce unnecessary groundworks

A UK EV infrastructure strategy with utility and highway authorities.

Standardised policies for shared infrastructure use

Strengthened collaboration between telecom, energy, and water sectors

Expand the use of climate-resilient materials in major street and road works projects

Integrating remote monitoring into standard industry practice.

Promoting investment in Al and digital tools for project planning and execution.

Pillar 4 Technology, Data and Decision Making (TIDD)

The group are arranging:

A call with 1Streetworks on their TM designing system

A call to view the REMOS system

A Pillar meeting in January to discuss the next steps for TIDD

A possible visit to City Fibre's training facility in Milton Keynes and a live demo (other pillar members will also be invited to attend not just TIDD)

Pillar 5 Collaboration & Consistency

The focus of Pillar 5 is that of consistency and collaboration.

The Group have had discussions on what the future of the industry should look like and what they can do to support transparency and uniformity.

They believe that communication is a key part of this.

The Group would love to have new members from both utility and HA backgrounds who feel they can contribute to this area.

combining a big-swim challenge with a journey and atmosphere like no other.






